What a goosebumps blessing to continue through our year long Roadmap program with pitstop #8: Worshipping in a Church as our topic!



Youth group is beginning again for the year on October 1, 6:30 pm—


8 pm. Every first Tuesday of the month, SOLC youth gather for some fast

#### A Message from the Pastor...

#### The Woman Who Forgot But Couldn't Forgive

We've all heard the phrase "forgive and forget." But forgiveness is not the same as forgetting. A few years ago I came across a striking story of a woman who forgot but could not forgive.

In the early 1900's, Swiss psychologist Edouard Claparede began working with a woman who suffered from a form of severe amnesia such that she could not form new memories, yet was otherwise quite mentally fine. Every day he would walk in, introduce himself to her as if for

the first time, and shake her hand. Each day she responded with a friendly welcome and say she had never met him before. Then one day Claparede did an experiment. He walked in and introduced himself and stuck out his hand for a handshake as normal, but this time he hid a pin in his hand and gave a sharp poke to the woman when they shook hands. The next day was

back to the usual routine: Claparede walked in and introduced himself to the woman and she said she had never met him before and had no memory of him. However, when Claparede smiled and extended his hand for a handshake, the woman immediately recoiled and looked suspiciously back at him. Even though she had no declarative memory of the previous day's incident, she still retained a distrust of Claparede. In other words, she had forgotten him, but she had not forgiven him.

In Matthew 18:35, Jesus says that we are to "forgive your brother from your heart." That is to say that forgiveness is not simply some spoken words or even a set of actions (though forgiveness should usually manifest itself in words and actions) but it also involves a change of heart toward a person. Jesus gives us this instruction as the conclusion to the parable of the unforgiving servant. In that parable, a man owes billions of dollars to the king, but he pleads with the king and has his debt forgiven. The servant then goes out and finds a fellow servant who owes him around \$10,000 and demands repayment, refusing to forgive. This unforgiving servant is then strongly condemned by Jesus not because he didn't technically have a right to have the debt paid back, but because the man's heart was so unchanged by the forgiveness that he received. Receiving God's forgiveness should change the way that we view others from our hearts.

Like the woman pricked by Claparede's pin, we too receive many different pokes and pains from people as we go throughout life. Some are small, others are quite big. Just like the pin-prick caused distrust in the woman and led her to keep distance from Claparede, so too these hurts from others cause mistrust and

lead us to keep our distance. Over the course of the years of life, these hurts can accumulate such that we can become like that amnesic woman, forgetting the specific hurts but still carrying distrust that erodes a relationship. That's why Jesus calls us to true forgiveness "from the heart."

As you go throughout life, consistently building up distrust through every little hurt or consistently choosing and finding forgiveness will make an enormous difference in your relationships. To be clear, having a "forgiving heart" doesn't mean that we don't ever address offenses done against us. (Redemptively addressing the issues is often a crucial part of forgiveness.) Rather, remembering God's abundant forgiveness to each of us and how eager to forgive he is, we reflect God's heart by living with the same eager openness to forgive "from the heart."
