FEET — Families Encouraging + Equipping Together


The theme for December's FEET event is Serving Our Community.

A Message from the Pastor...

Thankfulness and Happiness

"It's not the happy

people who are

thankful, but the

thankful people who

are happy."

A few years ago in preparation for Thanksgiving, I came across an old sermon preached by my Grandpa. In it, he made this point which has long stuck with me: "It's not the happy people who are thankful, but the thankful people who are happy." Thankfulness is not a result of being happy, but rather happiness is a result of being thankful.

I have a lot that I could complain about if I wanted to. Honestly, life has been pretty good in a lot of ways so maybe I have less now than at other times or less than other people, but

no matter what, I can always come up with things to complain about. I know you can too. That's why the devil has a song he likes us to sing that goes like this: "Count your problems—name them one by one. Count your problems—see how life's gone wrong." It's easy to spend a lot of time thinking on the things gone

wrong and mope about in a frustrated and despairing lot of ungratefulness.

On the flip side, I have sooooo much to be thankful for. God is good! He has blessed me in so many ways. The same is true for you. However, for whatever reason it's a lot harder to dwell on the good things. Problems demand attention. Blessings are much easier to ignore. So intentionally choose to spend time thinking on the good. (Don't ignore problems, just don't let them override the blessings!) That's why the Christian hymn (which the devil hates) says, "Count your blessings-name them one by one. Count your blessings-see what God has done."

God's Word tells us as much in Philippians 4:8. "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever

is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." This Scripture tells us to be intentional about what we think about, and that we should think about the good things of God.

Thanksgiving is a great time of year where we remind ourselves of these things. In spite of all the stress and problems of getting the house cleaned, turkey in the oven, food

served, and so forth, many people still get in a solid 2 minutes of time to practice this intentional thinking and thankfulness like the Bible teaches. It is a glorious 2 minutes!

I hope you read this before Thanksgiving. Start practicing *** this intentional gratefulness

and thinking on good things right now. Let's get practical: Set a 3 minute timer and just start writing out blessings and good things to think on. It doesn't take long, and if you're like me, by the time the timer goes off you'll be like, "I had like 10 more things I wanted to write but didn't have time!" That's ok, do this again tomorrow and write them down then! Do it today, tomorrow, and multiple days in a row. Hopefully it goes from being a practice to a habit, from a habit to an attitude, and from an attitude to a lifestyle. Then we shall be the grateful and joyful people God has made us to be!

After all, it's not the happy people who are thankful. It's the thankful people who are happy.:)
